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BANARAS HINDU UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

The Banaras Hindu University (BHU), founded by Mahamana Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya ji in 1916, is one of the most prestigious Central Universities in the country. An autonomous institution of distinction and having the Hon'ble President of India as its Visitor, BHU is the largest residential university in Asia. Being a living embodiment of visionaries such as Mahamana Malaviya ji, Dr. Annie Besant, and Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, this seat of learning epitomizes a synthesis of ancient wisdom and modern scientific temper. Its holistic model of education, conceived and enriched by its illustrious founder, offers refreshingly new perspectives to young minds and nurtures and facilitates their creative talents.

The Founder's Vision

- "It is my earnest hope and prayer that this centre of life and light, which is coming into
 existence, will produce students who will not only be intellectually equal to the best of
 their fellow students in other parts of the world, but will also live a noble life, love their
 country, and be loyal to the Supreme Ruler."
- "A teaching university would but half perform its function, if it does not seek to develop the heart power of its scholars with the same solicitude with which it develops their brain power. Hence, this university has placed the formation of character in youth as one of its principal objectives. The University

This university was conceived as a residential university, keeping in view its objective of complete character development and thorough mentoring of students. Perhaps this is the only university in the world where courses ranging from nursery and primary school up to doctoral/post-doctoral degrees are taught and pursued within a walled campus spreadover 550 Hectares (1360 acres) and having majestic buildings of great architectural delight.



It enshrines within its precincts, a phenomenal range of teaching disciplines incorporating almost all conceivable subjects of Science,

Engineering & Technology, Medical Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences, Commerce, Law, Education, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Sanskrit Vidya Dharm Vigyan, Agriculture, Veterinary Sciences, Library Science, Journalism and a large number of Indian and Foreign Languages.

There are at present 5 departments receiving support under Special Assistance Programme, 7-UGC-Innovative /TRIEA /Other Programme and 3-DST-FIST (Fund for Improvement of Science & Technology) 4 departments/schools are supported under FIST prgramme of DST. It also has four colleges admitted to the privileges of the university which are located in the city. The university also has three schools apart from having a Kendriya Vidyalaya housed in the Campus.

In addition, the Rajiv Gandhi South Campus has been established in the year 2006 in a sprawling campus of 1092.6 Hectares (2700 acres) located about 75kms away from the main campus, at Barkachha in Mirzapur district, Uttar Pradesh.

Hall mark of Excellence

In NIRF, Banaras Hindu University has been consistently ranked among the top universities of India and it has also been recognized as an Institution of Eminence in the country by the Ministry of Education, a recognition given only to five Public Sector Universities of the nation.

Institute of Agricultural Sciences

Committed to the objectives of holistic, sustainable and equitable development of agriculture and allied sciences, aimed at liberty, security and prosperity through competent human resource development by virtue of integrated approach of teaching, research and extension, determined for creation of knowledge base for the benefit of the farming community, improvement of crops/vegetables/ fruits/livestock/ poultry/ fish for enhanced input use efficiency & production, and committed for quality seed production and dissemination of proven technologies towards improving livelihood security and realizing the dream of Hunger Free Society, our achievements in Education (including Sports and Cultural activities) and Research (including Extension activities) justify the funds sanctioned, created and generated from time to time.



Institute of Medical Sciences

The Institute of Medical Sciences comprises three faculties, namely, Faculty of Modern Medicine, Faculty of Ayurveda, and Faculty of Dental Sciences. It offers medical and paramedical courses at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. Through its hospitals, it caters to the clinical needs of more than 20 crores population hailing from 7 states (UP, Bihar, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh) and neighbouring countries like Nepal and Bhutan. More than 40% of the patients visiting the hospital are from low economic strata.



At present, the hospitals have 2614 beds which includes 1385-Bed Sir Sunderlal Hospital; 180-Bed Ayurveda Wing; 334-Bed Trauma Centre; 13-Bed Dental Science; 430-Bed Centenary Super Page**4**of**15** Specialty Block; 100-Bed Mother & Child Health Wing; 60-Bed Centre of Excellence for Mental Health; 12-Bed Bone Marrow Transplant & Stem Cell Research Centre and 100 Bed Regional Institute of Ophthalmology.

Institute of Environmental and Sustainable Development

A National-level Institute of Environment & Sustainable Development was established in the year 2010. Recruitment of faculty was done in the year 2011. Using education as a tool to achieve sustainability, the institute aims to cover education for sustainable development. The mission of the Institute is to carry out teaching, research, and extension relevant to India's sustainable development, leading to a future that ends poverty and delivers and sustains efficient and equitable management of the country's natural resources.



Institute of Management Studies

The University started a Post Graduate and doctoral program in Management in the year 1968 as a Department in the Faculty of Commerce. Envisaging the increasing need for imparting quality University management education and research, the transformed the Department of Management Studies into an independent Faculty of Management Studies in the year 1984. Dedicated efforts were made to run innovative and need-based programs for the corporate world under the dynamic leadership of professors of national and international repute. The Faculty has been upgraded to the Institute of Management Studies in December 2015.



Institute of Science

Established in 1916, the Faculty of Science, which was later upgraded to the Institute of Science as a constituent institute of the University, offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses, besides offering Ph.D. programs and several diploma and certificate courses. The Institute comprises 13 Departments,6 Centres and 2 Interdisciplinary Schools. Equipped with advanced and sophisticated laboratories and research facilities, the institute is marching ahead towards excellence in teaching, learning, and research in almost all domains of basic and applied sciences.



Largest Residential Campus in Asia

Over 35,000 students from all over India and abroad are enrolled in various faculties of the university. The university has more than 72 hostels, with nearly 11000 inmates, with all modern amenities, including internet, for the students. It also has a specially designed International Student hostel to accommodate a large number of foreign students who study here. It also has 1590 staff quarters and 7 guest houses on the campus.

Library

BHU has a Central Library system having more than 15 lac volumes apart from subscription to more than 15000 online journals, 50000 e-books, databases, and a huge collection of digitized rare manuscripts. It functions in conjunction with a chain of Departmental, Faculty and Institute libraries. In addition, BHU has a fully air-conditioned Cyber Library with a seating capacity of over 200. Newly created air-conditioned PeriodicalHallprovides60cabinsfortheuseoffacultymembers and research scholars.



ICT Infrastructure

The University (Varanasi & RGSC both) has a Wi-Fi-enabled campus. All the academic and administrative offices are Wi-Fi connected. In addition, the University has a 240-kilometer-long fiber-optic backbone of campus-wide LAN, connecting all academic and administrative buildings as well as hostels with a well-equipped Computer Centre, providing high-end computing and training facilities. The university has been provided three 1 Gbps nodes of National Knowledge Network (NKN) under NME-ICT. Besides these, more than 100 smart classrooms have been augmented for smoothening the online teaching and learning, especially during the COVID times. The university has switched over to a computer-based entrance test and implemented ERP for executing all administrative and financial work, thereby moving towards a paperless office.

The Temple

The Banaras Hindu University has a temple of Lord Shiva called Shri Vishwanath Temple. It is situated at the center of the campus. The temple is built with white marble. Its detailed planning was done by Malaviyaji himself. The lush campus of Shri Vishwanath Temple and the beautiful gardens surrounding it are a delight to the eyes of the visitors. The interior of the temple has a Shiva Lingam, and verses from Hindu scriptures are inscribed on the walls of the temple with pictorial depiction.



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Bharat Kala Bhavan


BHU has a museum of international importance - Bharat Kala Bhawan, which is a treasure trove of rare art and artefacts. The Bharat Kala Bhavan has 13 galleries having a collection of more than 1 lakh antique and rare sculptures, miniature paintings, Rajasthani, Mughal and Pahari paintings, coins, jewelry, precious stones, etc. of immense historic value and a very special literary



gallery containing manuscripts of famous authors. It also has a rich library containing rare books.

Rajiv Gandhi South Campus

The Banaras Hindu University has extended its outreach by establishing its South Campus at Barkachha in, Mirzapur district. The RGSC is being developed as a potential hub of education, training, and entrepreneurship for youth and women, especially those belonging to tribes and weaker sections of society. The campus is being developed by the University with a mission to enrich the lives of the population of the region by extending to them opportunities to engage in life-long learning and to benefit from the result of research.



Faculty of Veterinary and Animal Sciences

Faculty of Veterinary and Animal Sciences was established in the year 2015 with the inception of the idea to have a surge of elite veterinary experts from the world-renowned central university, Banaras Hindu University. With the mission approach veterinary faculty came into existence and started its functioning under Institute of Agricultural Sciences. The Faculty comprises of 15 departments and 2 units (Livestock farm Complex and Teaching Veterinary Clinical Complex) and it is spread in an area of 126 acres. Presently faculty is having core strength of 60 faculty member's expertise in different horizon of veterinary profession. All the departments are well versed with modern facilities of teaching and research.

PROFESSIONAL COURSE: FACULTY OF VETERINARY AND ANIMAL SCIENCES
 Course Code No .136: Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry
 Duration: 5^{1/2} Years including one year Internship

<u>MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:</u> A candidate shall not be admitted to Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry degree course unless

- a) He or she has completed the minimum age of 17 years and the maximum age of 25 years on or before the 31st December of that year of his or her admission to the 1st year of Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry course; and there shall be relaxation of maximum age by five years_for Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe or Other Backward Class candidates.
- b) He or she has passed the qualifying examination as defined under these regulations with the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Biotechnology and English (as a core course) and obtained 50% marks in aggregate of these subjects or an examination equivalent to intermediate science examination of an Indian University or Board recognised by the Association of Indian Universities taking Physics, Chemistry and Biology including a practical test in each of these subjects and English.

AGE: Not to be less than 17 years and not more than 25 years on 31st December 2025 (applicant should be born on or after 31st December 2000 and on or before 31st December 2008).

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Number of Seats: Faculty of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, (RGSC) [Max.:60 seats out of which 15 % i.e. 09 seats will be filled by Veterinary Council of India] and the remaining 51 seats will be filled by BHU as per the reservation policy followed.

Note: The B.V.Sc. &A.H. is to run at Rajiv Gandhi South Campus (RGSC), Barkachha, Mirzapur regular fee ₹ 56,089 1st Professional Year and ₹ 50,314 for 2nd/3rd/4th/5th or Internship Programme) per professional year as prescribed by the University. Tentative Hostel Fee for 1st year ₹ 7,500 p.a. and ₹ 5,500 p.a. from 2nd year onwards.

*Note: Horizontal reservation to be given for PwBD candidates as per their merit against the category i.e. General/ OBC/SC/ST to which they belong.

2. RELAXATION IN MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHEDULED CASTES (SC), SCHEDULED TRIBES(ST), OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES(OBC) AND PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED(PWBD) CANDIDATES:

- a) In respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes or other special category of students as specified by the Government from time to time, marks required for admission shall be 5 % less than that prescribed for general category
 - i.e. 47.5%* in the aggregate in the qualifying examination and appeared in the NEET 2025.
- b) (ii) For OBC and PC candidates there will be a relaxation of 5% marks i.e. 47.5%* in aggregate in the qualifying examination in minimum eligibility requirements, in comparison to general category candidates & appeared in the NEET 2025.
 - *As per MSVE-2016 (Minimum Standard of Veterinary Education) standards.

3. RELAXATION IN UPPER AGE LIMIT FOR SC/ST/OBC CANDIDATES:

There is an age relaxation of 5 years in upper age limit for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC for admissions in B.V.Sc. & A.H.

4. NOTES RELATED TO MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT:

- (i) Not with standing anything contained in the Prospectus of Studies regarding the Courses in which admission is made through NEET 2025 All India Rank, the eligibility requirements for the purpose of admission shall be only those which are mentioned in the Information Bulletin of the academic session concerned.
- (ii) Application Forms of candidates who submitted forged/fake certificates or adopted fraudulent means shall be REJECTED. Further, such candidates shall be debarred from appearing in any subsequent Registration Process by BHU, if any.
- (iii) Applicants must fully satisfy themselves about their eligibility as prescribed above, before filling in the application form.

- (iv) Candidates admitted to any Course in this University shall not be eligible to pursue simultaneously any other full-time Course in this or in any other University/Institution.
- (v) The University reserves the right to cancel/refuse admission at any point of time if it is found that:
 - (i) Minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled.
 - (ii) False documentation has been done, or, facts have been suppressed.
 - (iii) Any other similar valid reason.

5. RESERVATIONS

(i) Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes:

Seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste (15%) and Scheduled Tribe (7.5%) candidates in each Course. Admission against these seats will be made provided the candidate has passed the Qualifying Examination and appeared in the NEET-2025. Every SC/ST candidate shall have to submit a self-attested copy of the Certificate mentioning that the candidate belongs to SC/ST community. Such certificates shall be subject to verification from the concerned District Magistrate. The following are empowered to issue the certificate:

- a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Addl.Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.
- e) Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates must note that Certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, his/her caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India schedule. The Caste Certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe
- (b) Whether he/she belongs to SC or ST
- (c) District and the State or Union Territory of his/her usual place of residence and Page**10**of**14**

(d) the appropriate Govt. of India schedule under which his/her caste/tribe is approved by it as SC or ST.

However, if an SC/ST candidate seeks admission under some other category (for example: PwBD etc.) the candidate should satisfy the minimum eligibility requirement for that category.

(ii) Other Backward Classes (OBC-NCL):

27 % Reservation to candidates belonging to OBC category (non-creamy layer) will be provided in different courses. The authorities to issue the OBC-NCL certificate are the same as in case of SC/ST provided in Section 5 (i) above. The caste in the OBC-NCL certificate will be those only which are in the list of Central Govt. Further, the OBC certificate should clearly mention that the candidate is non creamy layer. However, if an OBC-NCL candidate seeks admission under some other category (for example: PwBD etc.) the candidate should satisfy the minimum eligibility requirement for that category.

(iii) Persons with Bench Mark Disability (PwBD):

5% seats* are reserved on Horizontal basis for Divyang Category (Physically handicapped) candidates as per Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act,2016 and as defined in MSVE (B.V.Sc.& A.H.) regulations-2016.

*Horizontal reservation to be given for Divyang Category (PH) candidates as per their merit against the category i.e. General/OBC/SC/ST to which they belong.

A candidate shall not be allowed admission to B.V.Sc. &A.H. degree course if he or she suffers the following disabilities, namely:

- a) Disability of total body including disability of chest or spine more than 50%,
- b) Disability of lower limb of more than 50%,
- c) Disability of upper limb,
- d) Visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability,
- e) Candidates with progressive diseases like myopathies etc.
- f) Disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of a veterinarian.
- g) Note: The PWD candidates called for Counseling for possible provisional admission will be examined by a Medical Board constituted by BHU and if necessary, will be referred by the Medical Board toother recognized bodies for the purpose, as per criteria fixed by the University. The decision of the Medical Board constituted by BHU will be final.

(iv) Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs)

In accordance with O.M.F.No.12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019 of the Department of Higher Education, MHRD, Government of India, reservation for Economically Weaker Sections shall be provided in admission to the course during the Academic Session 2025-26.

The entire process of applying for admission in B.V.Sc.& A.H. course during the academic session 2025-26 has been made ONLINE. Accordingly, candidates may note that 2025 Information Bulletin and Application Form will not be sold (as there will be no offline mode) and the candidates desirous of admissions shall be required to register on the Registration portal of BHU and fill up the application form ONLINE as per procedure provided on the Portal. 4. DOCUMENTS IN ORIGINAL REQUIRED AT THE TIME OFADMISSION:

Only those candidates who are selected/waitlisted shall be informed through a 'notification to be seen on admission Portal by the concerned Dean of Faculty BHU about their admission. When the candidate will report for classes in the faculty on a particular date/dates, he/she shall have to bring with him/her all the necessary documents mentioned below in ORIGINAL failing which his/her admission shall NOT be considered.

- (i) Marksheets of High School/equivalent
- (ii) High School Certificate/equivalent Certificate.
- (iii) Marksheet of Intermediate (+2)/equivalent.
- (iv) Intermediate (+2) Certificate/equivalent Certificate.
- (v) Marksheet of the Qualifying Examination, if any.
- (vi) SC/ST/OBC Certificate on the basis of which reserved quota seat is claimed, if applicable.
- (vii) Transfer Certificate.
- (viii) PwBD Certificate, if applicable
- (ix) Migration Certificate, (if issued by the Board) to be submitted not later than 90days of admission.
- (x) NEET Admit Card
- (xi) NEET Score Card

Candidates must have in their possession all original documents such as High School Mark sheet and Certificate, Intermediate or equivalent Mark sheet and Certificate (if issued), Certificateof Reservation, Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate (if issued by the Board) at the time of admission failing which their admission shall not be considered. However, Mark sheet downloaded from the Website of the concerned examining body (subject to verification by the Admission Committee), CONFIDENTIAL MARKSHEETS or PROVISIONAL RESULTS issued by the Registrar/ Controller of Examinations of the concerned University or Secretary of the concerned Board (in case qualifying examination is of Senior Secondary level) shall also be entertained at the time of admission.

Online Application Form:

The Application Form for B.V.Sc & A. H. is available on the BHU's Admission portal https://bhu.ac.in/Site/AdmissionCounselling/1_2_16_Main-Site. The online application making process will have following steps:

Step 1: Registration on the Portal

This step involves authentication of Candidate's email id and mobile number. Candidates are required to have a valid email id and mobile No. (in use) for registration.

Step 2: Filling up Identification details - Only after successful registration on the Portal

[https://bhu.ac.in/Site/AdmissionCounselling], the candidates would be required to fill up an Identification Form giving particulars of the documents for authentication of their identity. For this purpose, following photo identification documents are allowed: (i) Aadhaar Card; (ii) Passport; (iii) Voter ID issued by the Election Commission of India; (iv) Bank Passbook affixed with the photograph (v) Driving License; and (vi) Pan Card; (vii) any other valid Government ID Number.

Step 3: Online Application Form Entry - After successful authentication of identity, candidates would be allowed to fill-up details in the online application form after ensuring their eligibility in the course.

Step 4: Uploading of photographs and signature- Candidates have to scan their photo and signature as per instruction given in the portal and upload it.

Step 5: Payment of Application Processing/ Entrance Test Fee- After the candidate has filled up the application form online and clicks on the "SUBMIT" button, he/she will be made payment of application processing/ test fee through online payment credit card/debit card through the payment gateway available on the portal.

Step 6: Printout of Application Form for the record of candidates- After online submission of application form and successful payment of Application Processing/ Test Fee, candidates are advised to take a printout of the online filled up application form (containing the details he/she has filled in and the transaction details of payment of application fee) for their own record.

Reasons for Rejection of the Application Forms:

- (i) Submission of application form without payment of requisite amount of Application Processing
- (ii) Any other inadequacy detected.

NOTE: If at any stage it is found that the applicant is not eligible for admission in a discipline under University rules, his/her candidature will automatically stand cancelled. Please note that thorough checking of Application Form, Minimum Eligibility requirements, Original documents in support of Academic Certificates and Categories-claimed will be done only at the time of admission. At that stage also, the candidature of the applicant will stand cancelled, if he/she

Decleration of Result

- (i) Admission to the B.V.Sc. & A.H. programs of the faculty will be made in order of merit based on the All-India Rank of the candidates in NEET-2025, conducted by the NTA.
- (ii) A separate final merit list shall be prepared from the total applicants under each category General, SC, ST, OBC, and EWS based on the All-India Rank of the candidates in NEET-2025, conducted by the NTA, after online verification of documents.
- (iii) A cut-off rank will be published after each round of result declaration. Applicants are advised to regularly visit the website for updates and results.
- (IV) The selected candidate will receive the payment link on his/her portal and must make the payment within the stipulated time. Failure to do so will result in the forfeiture of their merit, and the seat will be allotted to the next candidate on the waiting list.
- (V) After the completion of online admission procedures and declaration of results, only provisionally admitted students (those who have paid their admission fees) will be called for priginal document verification before the commencement of classes.

Note: 1. Applicants are required to upload the necessary documents at the appropriate section while filling out the application form on the portal.
