### **How to obtain Information of the RTI Act, 2005**

1. The person seeking information as per provisions of the **Right to Information Act, 2005** may apply on a plain paper giving particulars of information being sought and his/her correct address for communication to the Central Public Information Officer (CPIO) concerned designated vide Circular No. VCS/06-07/RTI/831 dated 30.03.2007 or to the Central Assistant Public Information Officer (CAPIO), Banaras Hindu University. The details of the CAPIO and the CPIOs are available on our website [www.bhu.ac.in](http://www.bhu.ac.in).
2. Separate applications for seeking information on different subjects are required.
3. A request for obtaining information under Section 6(1) shall be accompanied by an application fee of rupees ten by way of cash against proper receipt or by demand draft or bankers cheque or Indian postal order, payable to the Finance Officer, BHU.
4. For providing the information under Section 7(1), the fees shall be charged by way of cash against proper receipt or by MICR demand draft or bankers cheque or Indian postal order, drawn in favour of **Finance Officer, Banaras Hindu University, payable at Varanasi**, at the following rates :
  - (a) Rupees two for each page (in A4 or A3 size paper) created or copied.
  - (b) Actual charge or cost price of a copy in larger size paper.
  - (c) Actual cost or price for samples or models.
  - (d) For inspection of records, no fee for the first hour, and a fee of rupees five for each subsequent hour (or fraction thereof).
5. For providing information under Section 7(5), the fee shall be charged by way of cash against proper receipt or by MICR demand draft or bankers cheque or Indian postal order, payable to the Finance Officer, BHU at the following rates :

- (a) For information provided in diskette or floppy rupees fifty per diskette or floppy; and  
(b) For information provided in printed form at the price fixed for such publication or rupees two per page of photocopy for extracts from the publications.
6. Normal postal charges are not a charge on applicant under the RTI Act. The information may be despatched to an applicant by a CPIO through Post Office under Postal Certificate. If postal charges are excessive because of the bulk of the information, the applicant may be informed so that he/she can have the choice of seeking postal delivery or collect the information himself/herself from the concerned CPIO.
7. The fees to be charged under Section 7(1) & (5) and the postage charges, as mentioned above, will be intimated to the applicant concerned and may be paid through cash receipt /demand draft/ bankers cheque. However, the period intervening the dispatch of the said intimation and payment of fees shall be excluded for the purpose of calculating the period of supply of information, as provided under Section 7(1) of the RTI Act 2005, of 30 days.
8. The fees charges can be deposited in **cash in between 10.30 am and 1.30 pm** on all working days in the Finance Office of the University or by MICR demand draft or bankers cheque or IPO, drawn in favour of the **Finance Officer, Banaras Hindu University, payable at Varanasi**, to be submitted to the concerned CPIO or CAPIO along with the application.

### **Sir Sunderlal Hospital**

Kashi or Varanasi is the oldest living city in the world, known to exist from the ancient Vedic era. It is the cultural & literary capital of India since time immemorial. The history of Medical Education in Varanasi is at least 2500 years old. It has produced great scholars of Ayurveda like Divodas Dhanwantri and Charaka. It was here that the great Indian Surgeon Sushruta lived and practised Medicine and Surgery around the 5th century B.C. and also compiled his famous treatise, the "Sushruta Samhita". In this perspective it was but natural that Medical Education became one of the priorities of the then developing Banaras Hindu University way back in 1920. Mahamana Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya, our illustrious founder and great visionary had a foresight of imparting high status to the Ayurvedic System of Medicine. As a result of which Ayurveda was introduced as a curricular subject in the Department of Sanskrit Vidya Dharma and Theology of Banaras Hindu University as early as in 1922. With the high aims of service to suffering humanity as also imparting practical training to students of Ayurveda, the foundation of 96 bedded Sir Sunderlal Hospital was laid down in 1924 by His Highness Late Prabhu Narayan Singh, the then Kashi Naresh. It derived its name from Sir Sunderlal Ji, the first Vice Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University. Subsequently, a separate Ayurvedic College was established in 1927. In order to keep pace with the fast developments in the field of medical sciences in Western world, the study of Modern Medicine was also incorporated and the College of Medical Sciences came into existence 1960. Since then both Modern Medicine and Ayurveda are coexisting in this institution. Sir Sunderlal Hospital has continuously grown and reached to the

present status of 1200 bedded modern hospital for Ayurveda and Modern Medicine disciplines. This growth of the hospital has been exponential and being maintained looking into the needs of the society (Academically, Research wise, as well as in terms of Patient Care).

Sir Sunderlal Hospital is primarily a teaching and training hospital for the undergraduates, post graduates, super specialties and research courses run by the Institute of Medical Sciences in the various disciplines of medicine, nursing and paramedics. It is the only Tertiary care Hospital providing specialty and Super Specialty services to the health care needs of about 20 Crore population of Eastern UP, Western Bihar, adjoining MP, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand as well as neighbouring country of Nepal. It is a unique hospital to provide both Ayurveda and Modern Medicine services under one roof. It also cares for the health of approximately 60,000 people of the University community including students, teachers and employees and their dependents. 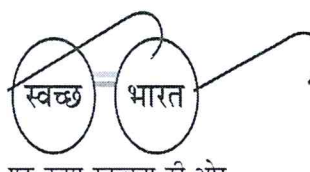

1. Room Reservation request will be accepted on prescribed application form only any other means i.e. e-mail or hand written letter will not be entertained, receipt will be provided on peon book.
2. Reservation can be done only through proper channel. Official Reservation should be routed through Head, Dean/Director and finally through competent authority. Non Official reservation application should be forwarded through Head/Dean of the department with seal and sign.
3. Incomplete room Reservation application form will not be entertained.
4. Instant reservation request may regret depending upon availability of rooms.
5. Confirmation of Non Official room reservation request will be declared 48 Hrs. earlier of guest arrival only.
6. Check-out time is on 24 Hours basis from check-in time of the guests. ( If Checked in at 11 a.m today then guest can stay up to 11 a.m tomorrow, after that new day will be counted from 1-24 Hours)
7. In case of cancellation of reserved room written request need to be submit at least before 24 Hours of guest arrival, no cancellation charge are applicable but in case of less than that one day retention charge will be deducted.
8. In case of non official room reservation requests one day advance through cheque need to be deposited in the favor of Chief warden- Guest House Complex, BHU payable at Varanasi at least before 3 days of guest's arrival. Only after receiving the advance room confirmation will be given by University Guest House Complex.
9. Accepting Reservation application form does not guarantee you rooms. Rooms will be allocated on priority basis i.e. BHU Official, BHU Non Official and then to others.

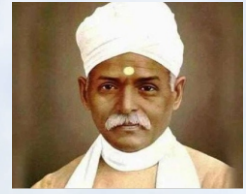
